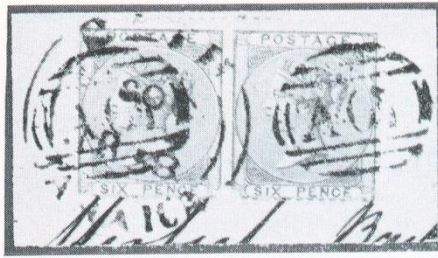

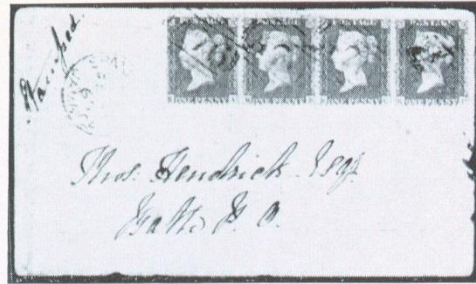

	42	cover	GRANGE HILL: 6d. lilac, fine hut a perf. short one corner, similarly cancelled on Dec. 1858 entire to London which shows "GRANGE HILL/JAMAICA" c.d.s. of Dec. 1858 with date in manuscript. Also another 6d. lilac, some perfs. slightly rust stained, similarly cancelled on Jan. 1859 entire to London which shows a "SAVANNAH-LA-MAR" c.d.s. Photo	43	cover	MONTEGO BAY: 4d. rose, a fine pair in a deep shade very clearly cancelled "A57" on a slightly stained 1859 entire to Kingston which shows the Montego Bay c.d.s. 	47	cover	ST. ANN'S BAY: 6d. lilac (perf. clipped at foot), with light but clear "A73" on 1859 cover to London which shows the St. Ann's Bay c.d.s. at hack. Also 4d. rose, a pair, one with wing margin and damaged, very clearly cancelled "A75" on large part of 1859 entire to Kingston which shows "SAVANNAH-LA-MAR" c.d.s. at back	2 ...	£7	9 0 0
	48	cover	SAVANNAH-LA-MAR: 1d. rose-red, two vertical and two horizontal pairs cancelled "A75" on 1859 entire to Kingston which shows Savannah-la-Mar c.d.s. at hack; one stamp is rubbed and another creased by fold but a scarce double rate. (See Photo)	8	£16	23 00.
Photo	49	cover	SPANISH TOWN: 1d. rose-red, a fine fresh strip RA-RD, fairly clearly cancelled "A76" on 1860 cover to Batu which shows a Spanish Town c.d.s. alongside. (See Photo)	4	£14	21 0 0
Photo	50	cover	1864, a slightly damaged solder's cover to England, endorsed "On hoard H.M.S. 'Shannon', Port Royal", and franked by 1d. rose-red cancelled in London. (See Photo)	1	£8	5 0 0

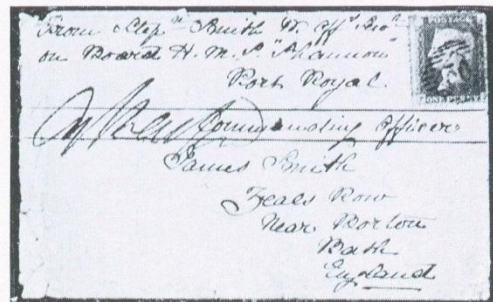
