NB. All Postmasters nominated by His Excellency the Governor, hold their appointments under a commission from His Lordship the Postmaster General; the other Postmasters hold their Offices simply under a letter from the Deputy Postmaster General.

The remuneration awarded by the Lords of the Treasury to Postmasters in Jamaica is 15 percent, on the actual amount of postage they collect, with the exception of the Postmasters of Mandeville, Plant River and Port Royal, who receive fixed salaries.
