### **Harrington A. Fairweather**

Acting PMG from June 1964, appointed PMG 15 Feb 1965 but immediately on 3 months leave prior to special duties in the Ministry of Communications and Works. 17 Oct 1966.

Winston G Brown acting PMG from 15 Feb 1965 and appointed PMG 5 Apr 1968

Still PMG 17 Oct 1966 (returning from UK after 3 Months) but not clear when relinquished the PMG post.

A member of the Government service for over 33 years, Mr. Fairweather has served nearly all that time in the Postal Service. He spent a short time with the Colonial Secretariat.

The new Deputy Postmaster General is Mr. Winston Brown, formerly the Assistant Postmaster-General in charge of the Postal Division. He is now acting Postmaster General.
