New Postmaster General Comes

Lt Col J Green arrived yesterday aboard the Bayane to take up the post of Postmaster general. His wife accompanied him.

Lt Col and Mrs Green were met by Mr F.O. Rousseau, acting PMG and Mr GA Smith of the Ministry of Communications and Works.

Col. Green retiring as PMG

COL. JOSEPH GREEN, Postmaster General, is going on leave prior to retirement on November 24. His three-year-contract with the Government ended in 1958 but was extended for one year.

Col. Green, 62, retired from the British Civil Service when he was Postmaster General of the Federation of Malaya. The Secretary of State appointed him to the Jamaica post.

He instituted training courses for counter workers in the Kingston area, based on United Kingdom practice, to increase the service's efficiency.

The Gleaner understands that the next Postmaster General will be appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Public Service Commission.

In the meantime, Mr. F. O. Rousseau, the Deputy, will act in the higher post, and Mr. F A. Fairweather assume Mr. Rousseau's duties. Other senior Officers will be moved up accordingly.
