Expected to retire 1 July 1999 but still referred to as postmaster Dec 1999, replacement in post Sept 2000

Samuel Stewart is new Postmaster, General

The New Postmaster General is Mr. Samuel F. Stewart, a Justice of the Peace who has been a Civil Servant since 1957.

Mr. Stewart entered the Civil Service as an accounting clerk in the Post and Telegraphs Department after which he worked in the Auditor General's Department, rising to the position of Auditor by 1971.

In July 1975 he was seconded by the Jamaica Civil Service Association as Associate Secretary before being re-assigned to the Auditor General's Department as Senior Auditor. He was appointed Audit Manager of that department in 1978 and Director of Audit in 1982. During this time he audited the accounts of the Cayman Islands as part of his special responsibilities.

Mr. Stewart, who received his secondary education at Waulgrove College, has been a registered public accountant since 1970. He holds certificates in Industrial and Labour Relations from Cornell University and in Public Sector Union Organisation, from a United States Agency for International Development (USAID) programme.

Mr. Stewart is currently serving as president of the Jamaica Civil Service Association, president of the Government Savings Bank Clerks Co-operative Credit Union and as a director of the Jamaica Co-operative Credit Union League Limited.

He is also a director of the National Housing Trust and the Caribbean Housing Finance Corporation.
