**K I N G S T O N,** Nov. 13.  
On Saturday the letter of marque  
schooner Endeavour returned from a  
cruise, with a French brig. her prize.  
On Tuesday his Majesty's ship Niger,  
Robert Lambert, Esq; Commander, con-  
ducted into Port-Royal two ships, a snow,  
a brig. and a sloop, her prizes; they  
were from Grenada to Curacao, in order to  
provide themselves with Dutch papers for  
their protection to some port in France.

On Wednesday his Majesty's Packet Boat  
Thynne, Capt. Jenking, arrived with the  
mails from Falmouth, after a passage of 41  
days.---The most important articles of in-  
telligence brought by this Packet are, that  
the combined fleets of France and Spain  
under the Count D'Orvilliers and Don An-  
tonis D'Arce, consisting of sixty-five ships  
of the line, besides an infinite number of  
frigates, &c. had entered the English chan-  
nel about the middle of August, and braved  
our coasts as far up as the Start, where  
they came to an anchor.---Our fleet, com-  
manded by Sir Charles Hardy, at that time  
was cruising twenty leagues to the west-  
ward of Scilly, and advice-boats were dis-  
patched from every port to give him notice  
of the strength and manœuvres of the en-  
emy, with orders from Administration to  
endeavour to gain Plymouth, as the dispa-  
rity of force between the two fleets would  
render an action too hazardous at this criti-  
cal time.---The whole kingdom, particu-

**17791120 Halifax Packet captured by American Vessel**

By a prize from Boston; sent into Port-Royal on Sunday by his Majesty's ship Bristol, we are informed that the Halifax Pacquet, which sailed from hence the 14th of July, for Falmouth, had the misfortune, within five days sail of the channel, to encounter an American frigate of 32 guns, to whose superior force, after an obstinate engagement, captain Bolderton was obliged to yield, several people being killed and a great number wounded; amongst the latter were Major Speisemacher of the 60th regiment, Mr. Robert Miligan of this place, another passenger who came from England in the vessel, and the captain; and the pacquet rendered a mere wreck by the fire of the enemy; who after the action sent her to Boston.
