As many inconveniences arise from the miscarriage of letters owing to a loose and negligent mode of collecting them at public houses and stores intended to go by men of War or merchant ships ... I do therefore ... give notice that in future there will be proper cases at this office for the reception of all letters which will be regularly secured, packed, and put in proper bags and under the seal of the G.P.O. be delivered to the masters of such ships, who may call for them the evening before they sail, and in failure thereof a boat with a responsible person will be in constant readiness of carrying mail bags on board. And whereas many letters for Great Britain are frequently put into this office to go by different ships, many of which may happen to be duplicates, it is therefore recommended to all persons that the name of the ship or vessel they wish the same to go by, may be wrote on the corner of each letter, which will be properly attended to, and put into that ship's bag accordingly.

This being the first office for entering ships, etc. coming to this island and, from its nature, the proper office of intelligence, the public may have . . . every interesting news that can be collected, by a discreet person, constantly attending the several arrivals in Port Royal Harbour for that purpose, to be conveyed from thence to this office with all possible despatch. And in order to deter in future any person or persons making or interfering with the making any collection of letters ... the following clause of an Act . . . 9th of Queen Anne is hereafter recited for general information.



And whereas, many letters for Great-Britain, &c. are frequently put into this office to go by different ships, many of which may happen to be duplicates; it is therefore, recommended to all persons, that the name of the ship or vessel they wish the same to go by, may be wrote on the corner of each letter, which will be properly attended to, and put into that ship's bags accordingly.



Copy of a letter from Capt. Blackhall of the Hillsborough Pacquet, to the Post-master general.

"SIR---I am very sorry to have occasion to trouble you on such a very disagreeable subject as the inclosed paragraph which I put into the St. Christophers Gazette on my arrival there will inform you.---In times of public calamity, individuals are the greatest sufferers, especially those that are obliged to follow the sea for their livelihood.---I have now had the experience of it, but it was impossible to get away from such a superior force."

"Mr. William Huey, one of my passengers, died the day we were taken, and Dr. Moodie, another passenger, was sent in the Hillsborough to America; the most of us they sent to St. Eustatia."

Extract from the Log Book of the Hillsborough Pacquet, George Blackhall Esq. commander.

"On Friday the 19th of May, saw a sail on the weather bow; immediately tacked from her. At 11 o'clock A. M. saw five sail a head; immediately tacked from them, set all sail, they gave chase. Saturday the 20th, between five and six P. M. saw another sail in chase.---At day light, we found we had gained about three miles by rowing; at noon a breeze sprung up. At 10 o'clock, the 21st, A. M. light winds, still employed rowing; two of the headmost sloops hoisted American colours and began to fire their broadsides to raze us; as soon as our shot could reach them, we hoisted our colours, and kept firing our stern chaces at them without shortning

sail; at four P. M. finding the rest of the fleet must be up with us in a very short time, and that we were not a match for such a force, we sunk the mail and hauled down the colours. In a few minutes, they were within hail and ordered us to hoist out our boat, and the captain was told to go on board a brig with a broad pendant, being the Commodore; she was called the Lively, Commodore Belt, from Baltimore, in Maryland."

The Hillsborough Pacquet had 6 four and 8 three-pounders, and 57 men. The squadron consisted of the brig Lively, commodore Belt, mounting 12 six and four pounders, and 45 men; the sloop Lincoln, Capt. Harrison, 8 four-pounders, 30 men; sloop Porpoise, 10 six and four pounders, 38 men; schooner Friendship, Bull, and a schooner *****, Jones.




