Of the two Packets, which arrive at Barbidos monthly from Europe, the first is book it . Itmaica. After remaining 48 homes at Barbert is she sails for S. Lucia, lands he Minis for that island, but without are oneg, and then fraceeds to Martinique, where she remains twenty-four hours, after which she prosentes her v.yage wishout further interrupts at.

Upon the day following the arrival of this Packet at Barbados, at 4 P. M. to e Mail B ats are dispatched as fellows :-

One takes the Mails for Tobovo, Tringlad, Greatda, and St. Vincen's: The Tringlad Mails are landed at Macaripo, so that the Mail-Boat does not go up the Gulph, or afford any opportunity for Passengers to or from Port d'Espagne-proceeding to Grenada and St. Vincent's, she fetches back the Island Mails to Barbados.

Another takes the Mails for St. Lucia, Dominica, Guadaloupe, Antigua, Montserrat, Nevis, St. Kitt's, and the Leeward I lands. Upon her arrival at Antigua, one of the Mail Boats, belonging to the Leeward Station, proceeds with the Mails to Montserrat, Nevis, and St. Kitt'swhile the Mail-Boat from Ba bados returns with the I land letters to Ba bados, calling on the way at every Islard.

The second monthly Packet, which arrives at Barbados, remains 48 hours in Carliste Bay, and then proceeds on her route among the Islands, seldom reaching Antigua before the expira ion of twelve days; upon her arrival there the Leeward Island Mails are occasionally dispatched by the Government Vessel. At 4 P. M. on the day succeeding her arrival at Barbados, two Mail-Boats are disparched as tolinws : One procerds to Port d'Espiene, Trinidad, and, having taken on board the Mails to: Europe, priceeds to Greman, where the awaits the arrival of the record Mail-Boat, which started at the same time for Tobago, St. Vice mi's, and Granida .--After neeting, one of the Boars proceeds with ber Laropen Mails fron Trinded, Tobago, , St. Vu cent's, and Grenada, to St. Kitt's, which last island she you rolly reaches about the same time with the Packet, on board of which she deposits her Mails; er, if she he not arrived or be cone, she leaves them at the Post-office. The other Mail-Bost returns direct from Grenaga to Barbados.
