G.P.O. Notice

1st December, 1864

Inland- Postage ... On and after 1st January, 1865, the 4d rate of postage will be abolished, and a uniform rate of three pence charged upon all letters not exceeding ½oz in weight will be conveyed a distance exceeding 30 miles, except upon inter-parochial which will be taxed as at present, 2d.

The present rate of progressing for heavier letters will continue as at present.
