

JAMAICA-Nº 33 OF 1868.



A Law to Provide for the Collection of certain Duties by Means of Stamps. [1st September, 1868.]

E it enacted by the governor of Jamaica, with the advice and DE it enacted by the governor of bandace, consent of the legislative council thereof, as follows:

First—This law may, for any purpose, be cited as "The Stamp Short title. Duty Law, 1868."

Second - From and after the coming into operation of this law Duties in sche. there shall be raised, for the use of the government of this island, raised after law upon and in respect of the several instruments mentioned in the in force. schedule to this law annexed, the several duties therein respectively specified.

APPOINTMENT AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS IN THE STAMP DEPARTMENT.

Third-The present commissioner of stamps shall, without any Present stamp new appointment, be the commissioner of stamps under this law, re appointed and shall hold his office during pleasure; and on the removal, his office being during pleasure death, resignation, or other vacancy in the said office, the governor may nominate and appoint a successor to such office, who shall have the like powers, authorities, and duties.

Fourth-It shall be lawful for the governor to nominate and Governor to appoint a clerk in the office of the treasurer, to attend in the stamp in the treasurer office, and to be present with the commissioner of stamps at er soffice to act with commisthe time of the delivery out of adhesive stamps, and the impressing sionerof other stamps, and to perform the several other duties hereinafter in this law mentioned.
