PACKET LETTERS CONTAINING DUTI-
ABLE ARTICLES.

THE Public are reminded that under the Universal Postal Union it is forbidden to send by Post any Packets whatever containing Articles liable to Customs Duty.

It is the rule of the British Post Office to return to the Country of origin every Packet received by Mail containing any such article ; but so as to avoid any unnecessary inconvenience to the public the Jamaica Post Office has elected to detain such Packets in Kingston for inspection by the Customs Authorities, in order that any Import Duty owing may be paid by the Addressee before delivery.

It will save trouble if the Rule quoted in the first paragraph of this Notice be strictly obeyed in future.

Communication between Dry Harbour and Savanna-la-Mar, with intermediate Stations, was restored on 21st.
There was not any communication on the St. Ann's Bay and Port Antonio Section from 19th to 31st.
