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**POSTAL ARRANGEMENTS
BETWEEN THE**

Cayman Islands and Jamaica.

FOR the improvement of Postal communication between the CAYMAN ISLANDS AND JAMAICA, the undermentioned arrangements have been approved :—

I. FROM JAMAICA.

Letters, &c., addressed for delivery at any of the Islands within the Cayman Group posted within Jamaica AND FULLY PRE-PAID BY JAMAICA POSTAL STAMPS at the ordinary inland rate, will be forwarded, as opportunity may offer, to the address of the Custos at Grand Cayman, who has undertaken to have such correspondence delivered.

Letters, &c., received from Places Oversea will also be forwarded for delivery.

II. FROM THE CAYMAN ISLAND.

Letters, &c. originating in the Cayman Islands and intended either for delivery in Jamaica, or for transmission to any place Oversea will be treated by the Jamaica Post Office as though they had originated in Jamaica.

The Custos of Grand Cayman is supplied with Jamaica Postage Stamps so that any such correspondence may be fully pre-paid.

If unpaid or not sufficiently pre-paid any such letters, &c., will be surcharged with double the deficient postage.

III. At present, and until a more complete Postal Exchange can be arranged, Correspondence to and from the Cayman Islands CAN NOT BE REGISTERED.
