I have the honour to forward the following Report of the transactions of this Department, embracing the period of eighteen months from the 1st (Jetubur, 1889 , to the 31st March, 1891.
2. The cash receipts for the first six months of the above period, namely, from the 1st October, 1889 to the 31 st March, 1890 , were $£ 9,329$ is. $1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{~d}$., being in excess of the Listimate $(£ 8,000)$ by $£ 1,32!91 \mathrm{~s} .1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{~d}$.
8. Those for the succeeding twelve months to the 31 st Murch, 1891, constituting the new Financial Year were $£ 19,39010 \mathrm{~s}$. 10 d ., being in excess of the Estimate ( $£ 16,000$ ) by $£: 3,390$ 10s. 10d.
4. Statement. No. 1, given below, shows that the agyregate collections for the balf-year above referred to were $£ 1,68812 \mathrm{~s} .11 \frac{3}{4} \mathrm{~d}$. above those of the corresponding previous half-year ; and $£ 1,202168.10 \frac{3}{4} d$. above the average of the last three corresponding half-yeurs.
