THE Officer Administering the Government directs the publication of the following Regulation as to the detention of Postal Packets bearing fictitious or already used Stamps, which has been made by His Honour under Section 47 of the Post Office Law 18 of 1868, in substitution for Regulation 192 of the Regulations in force under the Section of the Law in question.

A Regulation made by His Honour the Officer Administering the Government of Jamaica, under the powers conferred by Section 47 of "The Post Office Law, 1868," in lieu of Regulation 192 of the regulations heretofore made and now in force under the Section of the Law aforesaid.

Regulation 192 of the Regulations heretofore made by His Excellency the Governor of this Island and now in force, under and pursuant to the provisions of Section 47 of the Post Office Law, 1868, is hereby cancelled, and the following Regulation is now made by His Honour the Officer Administering the Government in lieu thereof and shall hereafter be regarded and referred to as Regulation 192, that is to say:—

192. In case any Post letter shall, in course of its transmission or intended transmission through the Post come into the hands of any Officer of the Post Office, as defined by Section 53 of the Post Office Law, 1868, bearing by way of denoting payment of postage any Postage Stamp as defined by Law 1 of 1887, which, in the judgment of such Officer as aforesaid, is a forged or counterfeited Stamp or a Postage Stamp which has been used before to denote payment of postage but from which have been obliterated the marks denoting such use and whether such Postage Stamp shall be a British or a Foreign Stamp as defined by Section 1 of Law 1 of 1887 aforesaid, such Officer is hereby authorised and required not to deliver the same or continue its transmission by the Post but to detain such letter and deliver it to the Postmaster for Jamaica, and the said Postmaster is hereby authorised and required to deal with the said letter in such manner as in his judgment will best conduce to the detection of the person guilty, whether in this Island or in any other country, of using the Postage Stamp aforesaid and best enable him to carry out the Regulations of the Postal Union with reference to the use of such Stamps.
