A LAW to continue various expiring Laws.

WHEREAS Law 3 of 1916 and the Laws mentioned in the Schedule to this Law as amended Prea by Law 1 of 1917 are limited to expire on the thirty-first day of March nineteen hundred and eighteen and Law 13 of 1916 is limited to expire on the said date with respect to the increased duty thereby imposed on Rum, Beer, Matches, Cigars and Pipe Tobacco:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for the continuance as in this Law mentioned of those Laws :

Be it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Council of Jamaica, as follows:----

1.—This Law may be cited as the Expiring Laws Continuance Law, 1918.

2.—The Tariff (Temporary Increase) Law 1916 (Law 3 of 1916) and the Laws mentioned in the schedule to this Law as amended by the Expiring Laws Continuance. Law, 1917 (Law 1 of 1917) shall with the exception of the words and figures "Sugar on every ton of twenty hundredweight £0 7s. 6d." occurring in the schedule mentioned in section 5 of Law 1 of 1917 he continued until and including the thirty-first day of March nineteen hundred and nineteen and the Excise Duties (Increase) Law, 1916 (Law 13 of 1916) shall as to the increased duty on Rum, Beer, Matches, Cigars and Pipe Tobacco be continued until and including the said thirty-first day of March nineteen.
