**T**HE following order made by the Governor in Privy Council to-day is published for general information.  
 By command,  
 H. BRYAN,  
 Colonial Secretary.

By virtue of the powers conferred by Section 4 of Law 14 of 1910 (substituted for section 8 of Law 51 of 1908), I, the Governor of Jamaica, with the advice and consent of the Privy Council do, with the purpose of collecting the sum of one half-penny on each letter and postcard in addition to the amounts payable before the 1st April, 1916, vary and settle the rates of postage as set out hereunder, viz:—

I. The Schedule of Rates of inland postage in Schedule A. of Law 14 of 1910 is varied so that in respect of letters and post cards the rates shall be the following:—

LETTERS.	
For the first ounce or fractional part thereof	One penny half-penny
For each ounce or fractional part thereof after the first ounce	One penny.
POSTCARDS.	
Single	One penny
Reply paid	Two pence.

II. These Rates shall have effect as from the 1st April, 1921, and shall last until and including the 31st March, 1922.

The following is the description of a penny adhesive stamp to be used for postage and revenue purposes.

This stamp will be put in circulation on the 3rd October, 1921.

The design of the stamp is denoted by the figure of an Arawak woman seated on the ground in front of her hut preparing Cassava. At the top of the design is printed Jamaica in white on an orange background and on each side on a shield the denomination 1d. At the bottom of the design is printed in orange on a white background the words "Arawak Making Cassava." At the sides and bottom of the frame are shown Arawak implements, weapons and pottery.

The colour of the stamp is a light red set in a frame of orange with a white border.

The following is a description of a penny adhesive stamp to be used for postage and revenue purposes.

This stamp will be put into circulation on the 3rd October, 1921.

The design of the stamp is denoted by the figure of an Arawak woman seated on the ground in front of her hut preparing Cassava. At the top of the design is printed JAMAICA in white on an orange background and on each side on a shield the denomination 1d. At the bottom of the design is printed in orange on a white background the words "Arawak making Cassava". At the sides and bottom of the frame are shown Arawak implements, weapons and pottery.

The colour of the stamp is a light red, set in a frame of orange with a white border.
