**1 Apr 1922; Overseas Rates [Gazette 16 Mar 1922]**

NOTICE.

From and after April 1st, 1922, the following important changes in the postage-rates on letters and post-cards *addressed to places abroad* will come into effect:—

- I. The letter-rate for the British Empire will be, two pence (2d.) for first oz., and penny-half-penny (1½d.) for each additional oz.
- II. The letter-rate for all Foreign Countries (*except the United States*) will be, three-pence (3d.) for first oz., and penny-half penny (1½d.) for each additional oz.
- III The letter-rate for the United States of America (*not including possessions of the U.S.*) will remain as it now is, namely: 2½d. for first oz., and 1½ for each additional oz.
- IV. The post card rate for all places abroad (*irrespective of address*) will be, penny-half-penny (1½d.) for each single card, and threepence (3d.) for each reply-paid card.

The local rates of postage remain unchanged.

**Apr 1922; PO Easter Opening hrs [Gazette 13 Apr 1922]**

NOTICE.

During the Easter holidays the branches of the General Post Office will be open as under:—

On Good Friday the circulation branch will be closed. All other branches will be closed.

On Easter Monday the Circulation Branch will be open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. The Parcel Post Branch will be open from 9 a.m. to 12 noon. All other branches will be closed.

Street Letter Boxes will be cleared on the first three clearances only.

District Post Offices will be open on both days for one hour after the receipt of the mails from Kingston and for one hour before the despatch of the mails to Kingston. All telegraph stations will be closed on both days except between the hours of 7 and 9 a.m.

The daily exchange of mails by trains between Kingston and offices on the Railway line, and between Kingston and Cross Roads, Half-way Tree, Gordon Town, Newcastle, Liguanea, Port Royal, Constant Spring, Windward Road, Smiths Village, Jones Pen, Myers Wharf, and Lascelles will be suspended on Friday the 14th instant.

The design of the stamp is represented by a view of the Town and Harbour of Port Royal. The denomination 6d. is shown on labels at the bottom of the stamp in the left and right corners, and between, are the words and figures,

Town and Harbour of Port Royal, (about 1850).

An anchor is shown on each side of the word "Jamaica" which is printed at the top. On the left is printed "Postage" and on the right "Revenue."

The border of the stamp is blue and the design is in grey.
