A LAW to continue various expiring Laws.

BE it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Council of Jamaica as follows:-

1. This Law may be cited as the Expiring Laws Short title Continuance Law, 1924. Short Title

2. The Laws mentioned in the Schedule to this Law shall be continued until and including the thirty-first day of March nineteen hundred and twenty-five

Laws mentioned in schedule continued

SCHEDULE.

- 1. The Post Office (War Tax) Law, 1919 (Law 7 of 1919)
- 2. The Package Tax (Temporary) Law, 1919 (Law 9 of 1919.)
- 3. The Excise Duties (Temporary Increase) Law, 1920 (Law 9 of 1920) with the exception of the last item in the Schedule of the said Law which imposes a surtax of ten per cent on amounts payable as King's Warehouse fees.
