XVI.--Report by the Deputy Stamp Commissioner.

Sir,
I forward herewith four Statements marked A, B, C and D, containing the statistical information in connection with the working of this Office for the financial year ended 31st March, 1927.
2. Statement A. deals with the Estate Duties. During 1926-27, the duties collected amounted to $£ 25,00219 \mathrm{~s}$. 1d. or $£ 6,70519 \mathrm{~s}$. 4 d , in excess of the duties collected during the previous year. Six Estates paid sums in excess of $£ 1,000$ and one of these Estates, which fell in towards the end of the financial year, paid a sum in excess of $£ 6,000$. Another large Estate fell in towards the end of the year, on which a large sum was accepted on deposit, pending the filing of the Revenue Affidavit.
3. Statement B. shows the duties collected for Probate, Legacy and Succession Duties. The amount collected for 1926-27 amounted to $£ 14,956$ 0s. 8d. and is $£ 4,6976 \mathrm{~s}$. 1 d ., in excess of the previous year. This excess practically represents the Succession Duty paid in commection with a large trust Estate, the funds of which were distributed towards the end of the financial year.
4. Statement C. is a statement of Stamp Duties collected in this Office. It includes the Death Duties and most of the items grouped in the Estimates under the head of "Various." The total duties amounted to $£ 69,29310 \mathrm{~s} .2 \mathrm{~d}$. or $£ 12,36518 \mathrm{~s}, 4 \mathrm{~d}$, in excess of the previous year. After deducting
the Death Duties, the items under "Various" total $£ 29,33410 \mathrm{~s} .5 \mathrm{~d}$., as against $£ 28,36117 \mathrm{~s} .6 \mathrm{~d}$. for the previous year, a net increase of $£ 972$ 12s. 11d. The principal increases are accounted for under Conveyances, Bank Cheque Books, Admission of Solicitors, Memorandum of Articles of Association and Immigration Certificates.

The principal decreases are shown under Mortgages, Transfer of Shares, Insurance Licenses, Fire Policies, Probate Papers and Passports.
5. Statement D. shows the duties collected from all sources. The total duties amounted to $£ 77,941$

\section*{RATES OF POSTAGE.}

The following are the rates of postage, local and overseas.
LOCAL:- Letters-1d. for each oz. or fractional part of an oz.
Post Cards-Single, 2d. Reply paid, 1d.
Printed and commercial papers \(1 / 2 \mathrm{~d}\) for each 2 oz .
Local (and British) newspapers and local magazines- \(1 / 2 \mathrm{~d}\). for each copy.
Parcels-(a) 1d. for each 2 oz.; (b) 4d. per lb.
A local packet of "Printed" or "Commercial" Papers may not exceed 3 pounds in weight, nor 2 feet in length, nor 1 foot in width or depth, except it be intended for transmission as a parcel.

The LOCAL rate of postage on "Printed" and on "Commercial" Papers is the same, viz., ( \(1 / 2 \mathrm{~d}\). for each 2 oz.) but for OVERSEA mail the rate differs. See "Overseas" below.
Parcels.-Under scale (a) a parcel may not exceed I lb. in weight, 2 feet in length nor 1 foot, in width or depth. (Under this scale the postage is Id. for each 2 oz .)
Underscale (b) a parcel may not exceed 11lbs in weight nor 1,000 cubic inches in size, three feet in length and 1 foot in width or depth. (Under this scale the postage is 4 d . per lb .)
Registration fee-2d. (See Registration, (Inland) p. 152.)
Advice of Delivery fee-2d.
OVERSEA:-Letters-1 \(1 / 2\) d. for the first oz. and 1d. for each additional oz. for the British Empire; and \(2^{1 / 2 d}\). for the first oz. and \(11 / 2 \mathrm{~d}\). for each additional oz. for all other countries in the Postal Union.
