SUPPLEMENT TO THE JAMAICA GAZETTE.

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XVI.—Report by the Deputy Stamp Commissioner.

Sir,

I forward herewith four Statements marked A, B, C and D containing the statistical information in connection with the working of this office for the financial year ended 31st March, 1928.

2. Statement A deals with Estate Duties. During 1927-28 the duties collected amounted to £59,231 11s. 5d., or £34,288 12s. 4d. in excess of the duties collected during the previous year. Since the passing of the Estate Duty Law in 1916, the collections for the year were exceeded only by the collections for the year 1923-24 when the sum of £78,935 11s. 0d. was collected.

Ten Estates paid sums exceeding £1,000, including one estate which paid over £19,000 and another which paid a sum in excess of £11,000.

3. Statement B shows the duties collected for Legacy and Succession duties. These amounted to £8,449 16s. 7d. as against £14,956 0s. 8d. for the previous year, a decrease of £6,507 4s. 1d. The collections for 1926-7 include, however, a large trust estate which fell in during that year.

4. Statement C is a statement of Stamp Duties collected in this office. It includes the Death Duties and most of the items grouped in the Estimates under "Various." After deducting the Death Duties the items under "Various" total £33,346 15s. 6d. as against £29,334 10s. 5d. for the previous year an increase of £4,012 5s. 1d. The Statement shows substantial increases under most heads, the principal decrease being under "Admission of Solicitors."

5. Statement D shows the Stamp Duties collected from all sources. This statement includes the duties collected from the Banks on their note circulation. The collections on the circulation of notes show an increase of £1,099 13s. 3d. and this is principally due to one of the Banks circulating more of their own notes in place of Treasury Notes.

The total duties collected from all sources amounted to £110,728 0s. 3d. as compared with £77,941 12s. 1d. for the previous year, an increase of £32,786 8s. 2d.

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No. 479.—The Governor directs the publication of the following Law, Law 18 of 1928, entitled “A Law further to amend the Stamp Duty Law, 1903 (Law 40 of 1903)” which has been passed by the Legislative Council.

A LAW further to amend the Stamp Duty Law, 1903, (Law 40 of 1903).
[23rd May, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Council of Jamaica as follow:—

1—This Law may be cited as the Stamp Duty further amendment Law, 1928, and shall be read and construed as one with the Stamp Duty Law, 1903, (Law 40 of 1903), hereinafter referred to as the principal Law and any Laws amending the same.

2—Schedule B to the principal Law under the heading “Exemptions from the preceding duties on receipts” is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following further exemption:—

“Receipt given for or on account of any salary, pay or wages, or for or on account of any other like payment made to or for the account or benefit of any person, being the holder of an office or an employee in respect of his office or employment, or for or on account of money paid in respect of any pension, superannuation allowance, compassionate allowance or other like allowance.”
