Airmail Matter Is Sent By Steamer; Plane Made Detour

Seventy-five pounds of air.mail which should have left the Island y Pan-American Airways plane on Friday morning last, was sent by he United Fruit Co's steamer Ulua hich left Kingston at 2 o'clock hat afternoon for New York.

As was already mentioned in the Gleaner, the plane which should have left here on Friday morning for New York, owing to adverse weather had to make a detour and decided finally to land at Manzanilla, Cuba,

A large proportion of this mail was addressed to England and was posted in the expectation of con. necting at New York with the North German Lloyd transatlantic liner, "Bremen", to arrive in Engand on the 21st inst. This was he last mail to arrive in England for the Christmas.

The postmaster of the local Post Office decided, rather than keep the mail for the next airmail, to send it by the Ulua which was scheduled to arrive in New York at 8 o'clock no Wednesday morning of this week. The next airmail from Jamaica, if the plane leaves on time. is due to arrive in New York at 8,40 o'clock on the same morning, Wednesday

The postmaster at New York was cabled to on Friday by the post-master for Jamaica, asking him to take special delivery of the airmail which would arrive on the Ulua and send it out to the addresses through the regular airmail channels,

An irate husinessman who had posted letters to go by airmail to England by the last plane, expressed the view on Saturday that the plane could have left Manzanilla early on Friday morning to arrive at Kingston in time to leave just about 2 hours after schedule time She would then get to Miami, he went on, the same afternoon to be able to connect with the Bremen for England.
