With reference to Government Notice No. 1044, published in the Jamaica Gazette Extraordinary of the 8th November, 1940, the Officer Administering the Government in Privy Council on the 8th January, 1941, under the powers conferred by Section 8 of the Post Office Law, made the following Order amending the Air Mail Postage Rates:—

I, the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice and consent of the Privy Council in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 8 of the Post Office Law and of every other power hereunto enabling do hereby order and direct as follows:—

(1) That the Order settling the rates for all letters, parcels, books, book-packets and newspapers made by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Privy Council on the 8th day of February, 1939, and amended on the 6th day of October, 1939, and the 11th day of November, 1940, shall be and is hereby further amended by striking out that portion of the Schedule headed "Air Mail" and substituting therefor the Schedule to this Order.

(2) That this Order shall take effect as and from the 16th day of January, 1941.

With reference to Government Notice No. 29, published in the Jamaica Gazette of the 16th January, 1941, the Governor in Privy Council on the 21st April, 1941, under the powers conferred by Section 8 of the Post Office Law, made the following Order amending the Air Mail Postage Rates:—

THE POST OFFICE LAW

(Cap. 99).

ORDER

(Under Section 8 of the above Law).

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section 8 of the above Law, I, the Governor in Privy Council do HEREBY ORDER AND DIRECT that the rates for letters, parcels, books, book-packets and newspapers BE and the same ARE HEREBY ALTERED as follows:—

(1) That the Order settling the rates for all letters, parcels, books, book-packets and newspapers made by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Privy Council on the 8th day of February, 1939, as amended on the 6th day of October, 1939, 11th day of November, 1939 and the 8th day of January, 1941, shall be and the same is hereby further amended by striking out that portion of the Schedule headed "Air Mail" and substituting therefor the Schedule to this Order.

(2) That this Order shall take effect as from the fifth day of May, 1941.

REGULATIONS

(Made under the provisions of the above Acts and Orders in Council and every other power hereunto enabling).

THE JAMAICA DEFENCE (AMENDMENT) (No. 4) REGULATIONS, 1941.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Jamaica Defence (Amendment) (No. 4) Regulations, 1941 and shall be read and construed as one with the Jamaica Defence Regulations, 1940 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on the day of their publication in the Gazette.

2. Regulation 6 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion of paragraph (1) thereof and the substitution thereof of the following paragraph:—

“(1) The Governor may make provision by order—

- (i) for securing that postal articles in general or postal articles of any such description as may be specified in the order shall not be despatched by post from any place in Jamaica or its Dependencies to any other place either within or outside Jamaica or its Dependencies except in accordance with the order, and for all matters incidental thereto, and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the preceding provisions of this paragraph, any such order may, in relation to postal articles in general or to any description of postal article, direct that no postal article or no postal article of any specified description shall be despatched as aforesaid—
 - (a) except under the authority of a permit granted by such authority or person as may be specified in the order; or
 - (b) except there is upon the outer covering thereof such information as to the sender of the article and his address as may be specified in the order;
- (ii) for the removal from any postal article of anything contained therein which in the opinion of the Censor or any person by him authorised ought to be removed therefrom in the interests of public safety, defence, the maintenance of public order or the efficient prosecution of the war;

- (iii) for the disposal of any postal article posted otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of the order and of anything removed from any postal article pursuant to the provisions of sub-paragraph (ii) of this paragraph of this Regulation.

A prosecution in respect of a contravention of any order made under this paragraph shall not be instituted except with the consent of the Attorney General."

THE JAMAICA DEFENCE REGULATIONS, 1940.

No. 167

ORDER

(Made under Regulation 6 (1) of the Jamaica Defence Regulations, 1940).

THE POSTAL CENSORSHIP (GENERAL) ORDER, 1941.

1. This Order may be cited as the Postal Censorship (General) Order, 1941.
2. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph 3 of this Order, no person shall send any postal article to any person, whether within or without Jamaica, except there is on the outer covering thereof the name of the sender and either his usual place of abode or, if such postal article is sent on behalf of—
 - (a) any Government department, the name of such department; or
 - (b) any firm or company, the address at which such firm or company carries on business.
3. The provisions of paragraph 2 of this Order shall not apply to any postal article addressed to—
 - (a) any His Majesty's embassies, legations or consulates elsewhere than in Jamaica;
 - (b) any His Majesty's naval, military or air force bases, camps or other establishments, or any Government departments in the United Kingdom or in any His Majesty's Dominions, Possessions, Protectorates or Mandated Territories;
 - (c) any officer of the Government of Jamaica in his official capacity.
4. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph 3 of this Order, any postal article which does not comply with the provisions of paragraph 2 of this Order shall be detained by the postal authorities until such time as it may be applied for by the sender or by some person by him authorised, or in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph, may be delivered to the censor.
- (2) Where any postal article is detained under sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph, the censor or any person by him authorised may require the postal authorities to deliver such postal article to him to be disposed of in such manner as he may think fit.
