THE POST OFFICE LAW, 1941

NOTICE

(Under Section 8 of the above Law)

In exercise of the power conferred upon me by Section 8 of the above Law I, the Governor hereby give notice that from and after the publication hereof in the Jamaica Gazette postal articles posted by Members of His Majesty's Naval Forces serving in Jamaica shall, subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule hereto, be exempt from the payment of postage.

SCHEDULE

- 1. Such postal articles shall consist of ordinary letters not exceeding two ounces in weight.
 - 2. Such postal articles shall be transmitted by surface routes.
- 3. Such postal articles shall be handed in at the Orderly Room of the Unit to which the Member of the Force belongs.
 - 4. Such postal articles shall be addressed to persons in the United Kingdom.

The Governor in Privy Council on the 21st of June, 1943, under Section 7 of the Post Office Law, 1941, Law 60 of 1941, approved the following Order which was made by the Postmaster General on the 14th of May, 1943:—

THE POST OFFICE LAW, 1941

ORDER

(under Section 7 of the above Law)

THE POST OFFICE (POSTAGE RATE) (NAVAL PERSONNEL) ORDER, 1943

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Postage Rate) (Naval Personnel) Order, 1943, and shall come into force on the publication thereof in the Jamaica Gazette.
- 2. The rate of postage to be paid on postal articles addressed to persons in the United Kingdom by Members of His Majesty's Naval Forces serving in Jamaica shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto, provided that:—

(a) such postal articles shall consist of ordinary letters;

(b) such postal articles shall be transmitted by surface routes;(c) such postal articles shall be handed in at the Orderly Room of the Unit to which the Member of the Force belongs.

SCHEDULE

One penny half-penny for the third ounce or any fractional part thereof and for each additional ounce or fractional part thereof one penny.
