ENTITLED

A LAW to Amend the Jamaica Government Railway Law

BE it enacted by the Governor and Legislative Council of Jamaica as follows:-

1-This Law may be cited as the Jamaica Government Short title and Railway (Amendment) Law, 1944, and shall be read and construed as one with the Jamaica Government Railway Law (hereinafter referred to as the principal Law) and all Cap. 111. amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on a date to be appointed by the Governor by Proclamation published in the Gazette.

2-Sections 20, 21 and 22 of the principal Law and the Repeal and heading immediately above such sections are hereby of sections repealed and the following sections and heading substituted of principal therefor therefor-

Administration and Regulations

Power to make regulations.

- 20—(1) The Governor in Privy Council may make regulations generally for implementing or carrying out the provisions of this Law.
- (2) Regulations made under subsection (1) of this section may, without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred in such sub-section, provide—

(a) for the operation of the Railway;

(b) for the governance of passengers and freight transported by the Railway and for the conditions under which such passengers and freight may be so transported;

(c) for the governance of all persons being in or on any premises the property of

or used by the Railway;

(d) for the appointment, conditions of employment, and governance, of all persons employed in the Railway, other than persons holding pensionable offices within the meaning of the Pensions Law, 1944, and for the infliction of penalties, which may be enforced departmentally, on any such person contravening regulations made under this paragraph.

Power to suspend persons employed.

- 21—(1) The General Manager of the Railway may suspend from his duties any person employed in the Railway, other than a person holding a pensionable office within the meaning of the Pensions Law, 1944, pending such enquiry as he may see fit to order.
- (2) The General Manager of the Railway may suspend from his duties any person employed in the Railway and holding a pensionable office within the meaning of the Pensions Law, 1944, pending such enquiry as the Governor may see fit to order.

Power to dismiss certain persons.

- 22-The General Manager of the Railway may, after such enquiry as he may think fit to order,-
 - (a) dismiss any person employed in the Railway, other than a person holding a pensionable office within the meaning of the Pensions Law, 1944, · if satisfied that such person has been guilty of dishonesty, disobedience, negligence, insubordination, absence from duty without leave, or other misconduct, or if satisfied that such person is unable to discharge efficiently the duties of his office;
 - (b) impose on any person who has contravened any regulations made under paragraph (d) of sub-section (2) of section 20 of this Law such penalty as may be specified in such regulations."

3—Section 26 of the principal Law is hereby amended Amendment by the deletion from the fourth and fifth lines of the words of principal "By-Laws or".

4—Section 29 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor—

29—Every person who—

Repeal and replacement of section 29 of principal Law.

"Punishment for offences.

- (a) being employed in the Railway is found drunk on duty;
- commits any offence against this Law or against any regulations made thereunder;
- (c) wilfully or negligently does any act which injures or endangers or is likely to injure or endanger the health or life of any person in or upon Railway premises, or which obstructs, or is likely to obstruct, in any way whatsoever the passage of any train or other rolling stock,

shall be guilty of an offence against this Law and liable on conviction before two Justices of the Peace to a fine not exceeding ten pounds or to imprisonment with hard labour for any term not exceeding two months."

Amendment of section 30 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion from the second line of the words "Rules or By-Laws".

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Jamaica Government Railway Law (Cap. 111) in the fellowing respects:—

(a) by consolidating into one section regulation making powers which previously were contained in separate sections of the

principal Law;

(b) by clarifying and placing in a separate Part of the principal Law administrative provisions formerly contained in a Part of the Law which it is proposed to repeal by the Pensions Law, 1944;

(c) by simplifying section 29 of the principal Law.
