2. Rule 39 of the principal Rules is hereby amended in the following respects:-

(i) by the insertion after the word "shall" in the first line of the word "be"

- (ii) by the deletion of the figures and stop "7.00" from the first line thereof between the word and letters "open" and "a.m.". and the substitution therefor of the word figures and stop
- "from 8.00";
 (iii) by the insertion after the word "shall" in the second line of the word "be";
- (iv) by the deletion of the figures, letters and stops "7 a.m. to 9 a.m." from the third line thereof after the word "from" and the substitution therefor of the figures, letters and stops "8.00 a.m. to 10.00 a.m.".

Amendment of rule 41 of Telegraph Rules.

3. Rule 41 of the principal Rules is hereby amended in the following respects:-

graph (b) thereof and the substitution therefor of the figure "8"; (i) by the deletion of the figure "7" from the second line of para(ii) by the deletion of the figure "9" from the first line of paragraph
(c) thereof and the substitution therefor of the figures "10".
4. These Rules shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1944.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Privy Council by section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Regulations made on the 10th day of December, 1943, by the Postmaster General under section 7 of the said Law are hereby approved:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment)
Regulations, 1943, and shall be read and construed as one with the

The principal Regulations are hereby amended by the addition thereto immediately after regulation 163 of the following part as Part

XV:-

Part XV Administration

Hours during 164. Subject to the provisions of regulation 165 of these Regulations, which all Post all Post Offices, other than the General Post Office in Kingston, shall Offices other be opened for the transaction of all public business between the hours than the 8 of the clock in the forenoon and 5 of the clock in the afternoon each day General Post of the week other than Sunday and Public General Holidays.

Kingston, shall be opened for all public business.

Time for opening for special delivery of mails. 165. All Post Offices, other than the General Post Office in Kingston, shall, for the delivery of mails, but for no other purpose, be opened for not more than one hour after the arrival of the mail, provided that no Post Office shall be opened after the hour of 9 of the clock at night.

Hours during which General Post Office in Kingston shall be opened 166. The General Post Office in Kingston shall be opened for the transaction of public business as follows:—

 (i) for the distribution of letter mail, between the hours of 8 of the clock in the forenoon and 4 of the clock in the afternoon each day of the week other than Sunday and Public General Holidays;

(ii) for the receipt and delivery of parcel mail, the sale and encashment of money and postal orders and the receipt of moneys generally, between the hours of 9 of the clock in the forenoon and 3 of the clock in the afternoon each day of the week other than Saturday, Sunday and Public General Holidays:

(iii) for the transaction of the business enumerated in paragraph

(ii) of this regulation, between the hours of 9 of the clock in
the forenoon and 1 of the clock in the afternoon each Saturday
other than a Public General Holiday;

(iv) for the receipt and delivery of letter and parcel mail and the receipt of money generally, between the hours of 9 of the clock in the forenoon and 12 of the clock noon each Public General Holiday.

167. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1944.
