With reference to Government Notice No. 92 published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement, Proclamations, Rules and Regulations of the 29th of September, 1944, the Governor in Privy Council on the 15th of November, 1944, in exercise of the power conferred by section 7 of the Telegraph Law approved the Telegraph (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules, 1944, as set out:—

**THE TELEGRAPH LAW**

(Cap. 246)

**THE TELEGRAPH (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) RULES, 1944**

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Governor in Privy Council by section 7 of the Telegraph Law the following Rules made on the 4th day of November, 1944, by the Postmaster General under section 7 of the said Law are hereby approved:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Telegraph (Amendment) (No. 2) Rules, 1944, and shall be read and construed as one with the Telegraph Rules, 1933, (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) and all amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on the 23rd day of November, 1944.

2. Paragraph 7 of rule 1 of the principal Rules (as amended by the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1944) is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "an Officer of His Majesty's Forces" between the words "Secretary" and "an" in the third line thereof.
