The Governor in Privy Council on the 17th of November, 1944, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Post Office Law, 1941, approved the Post Office (Light Weight Air Mail) Order, 1944, as set out.

THE POST OFFICE LAW, 1941

(Law 60 of 1941)

THE POST OFFICE (LIGHT WEIGHT AIR MAIL) ORDER, 1944

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Governor in Privy Council by section 7 of the Post Office Law, 1941, the following Order made by the Postmaster General on the 2nd day of November, 1944, under section 7 of the said Law is hereby approved:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Light Weight Air Mail) Order, 1944, and shall come into force on the 27th day of November, 1944.

2. The Rate to be paid on air mail letters weighing not more than one-tenth of an ounce addressed to any place within the British Empire shall be six pence for every such letter.

3. Every such letter shall be written on a special light weight air letter form measuring not more than nine and one-half inches from top to bottom and eight inches across and printed as shewn in the Schedule hereto.
