THE SOCIAL GREETING TELEGRAMS (PROHIBITION) ORDER, 1944

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Rule 1AB of the Telegraph Rules, 1933 (as inserted therein by the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1943), I do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Greeting Telegrams (Prohibition) Order, 1944.
2. No person shall send any social greeting telegram between the 18th day of December, 1944, and the 3rd day of January, 1945.
3. In this Order "Social greeting telegram" means any telegram containing any greetings, congratulations, or good wishes.
