THE GOVERNOR directs the publication of the following Bills which it is proposed to introduce at the present Session of the Legislature entitled "A Law to Amend the Telephone Law" and "A Law to Amend Further the Poor Relief Law", together with Memoranda of Objects and Reasons for the Bills.

A BILL

ENTITLED

A LAW to Amend the Telephone Law.

ENACTED by the Governor of Jamaica with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives.

1-This Law may be cited as the Telephone (Amend-Short title ment) Law, 1945, and shall be read and construed as one tion. with the Telephone Law, hereinafter referred to as the Cap. 245. principal Law.

2-Section 5 of the principal Law is hereby repealed Repeal and and the following section substituted therefor—

"Power to licence telephonic works.

5—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Law. Law, the Governor in Executive Council may grant to any person a licence for any term not exceeding forty years to establish telephonic communication within any area

specified in the licence and for that purpose to erect and maintain poles and wires along, over, under or across, the public roads, streets, lanes and open spaces, within such area.

- (2) Any licence granted under this section may confer upon the licensee the exclusive right to establish or to maintain a telephonic system within the area to which the licence relates, or within any part of such area specified in the licence.
- (3) The Governor in Executive Council may, during the continuance in force of any licence, renew such licence for a further term of not more than forty years from the date of such renewal.
- (4) Where any licence is renewed under sub-section (3) of this section, such renewal shall take effect subject to such modification as the Governor in Executive Council may prescribe at the time of the renewal".

27—Nothing in this Law shall apply to the Law. telephone system maintained immediately before the 1st day of July, 1945, by the Jamaica Public Service Company Limited under the provisions of section 50 of the Tramways Law.

Exemption in favour of system maintained for the purposes of the Rio Cobre Irrigation Works.

28—Nothing in this Law shall apply to the telephone any telephone system maintained by or on behalf of the Government of Jamaica for the purposes of the Rio Cobre Canal Irrigation Works."

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to put it beyond doubt that the Governor in Executive Council has power to grant an exclusive licence to operate and maintain

telephonic communication within any specified area.

2. It is also sought to repeal section 6 of the Law which makes the consent of the Local Authority having jurisdiction over any area in respect of which a licence is sought a prerequisite to the application for the grant of such licence, and to extend the power of the Governor in Executive Council in relation to the holding of enquiries into the operation of telephone systems.

ENACTED by the Governor of Jamaica with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives.

"Exemption in favour of the existing telephone system maintained by the Jamaica Public Service Company Limited. Cap. 256.

27-Nothing in this Law shall apply to the telephone system maintained immediately before the 1st day of July, 1945, by the Jamaica Public Service Company Limited under the provisions of section 50 of the Tramways Law.

Exemption in favour of system mainpurposes of the Rio Cobre Irriga-tion Works.

28-Nothing in this Law shall apply to the telephone any telephone system maintained by or on tained for the behalf of the Government of Jamaica for the purposes of the Rio Cobre Canal Irrigation Works."
