POST OFFICE LAW, 1941

The Post Office, (CAYMAN ISLANDS SPECIAL RATE OF POSTAGE) ORDER, 1947

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Governor in Executive Council by section 7 of the Post Office Law. 1941, the following Order made on the 25th day of April, 1947, by the Postmaster General under section 7 of the above Law is hereby approved:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Cayman Islands Special Rate of Postage) Order. 1947 and shall come into force on the 12th day of May, 1947.
- 2. The rate to be paid on air mail articles addressed to the Cayman Islands shall be two pence half-penny for every half ounce.
- 3. The rate herein provided shall apply to articles to be carried by aircraft, of Jamaica Air Transport Limited.

B.W.I.A. Operation Figures Climb

Figures recently released by British West Indian Airways Limited, show that approximately 2,000 more passengers were carried in the 1947 January-April period, than for the corresponding period in 1946.

While the hours flown show a slight decrease, the route mileage covered by B. W. I. A., the passenger miles flown, and freight and mail carried, all show increases for the first four months of 1947 over 1946.

The route mileage for the period January-April 1947 was 349,486 and for 1946, was 337,978. The actual number of passengers carried by B. W. I. A. for this period in 1947 was 11,850 compared with 9,910 in 1946.

PASSENGER MILES

Passenger miles also increased for the first four months of 1947 by 435, 290 to 2,838,336. B. W. I. A. freight showed an increase of 10,000 lbs. over the corresponding period in 1946.

The international and inter-island mail carried by B. W. I. A. for the period in 1946 was 22,840 lbs, and in 1947 was 28,108 lbs.

Letters can be sent by airmail "via B. W. I. A." at the rate of 2½d per ½ oz. letter, points as far apart at British Honduras. Jamaica, the Windward and Leeward Islands, Barbados, Trinidad and British Guiana. The airmail rate applies only to British Colonies served on the B. W. I. A. system and is one of the lowest airmail rates in the world.
