The Governor in Executive Council on the 7th of January, 1949, under section 7, of the Telegraph Law, Chapter 246, approved "The Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1949" as set out:—

THE TELEGRAPH LAW

(Cap. 246)

THE TELEGRAPH (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1949

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Executive Council by section 7 of the Telegraph Law, the following rules made on the 7th day of January, 1949, by the Postmaster General under section 7 of the said Law are hereby approved:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Telegraph Rules, 1933, (hereinafter called "the principal Rules") and all amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of January, 1949.
- 2. Paragraph (2) of rule 1 of the principal Rule is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "one shilling and threepence" wherever the same appear in the said paragraph and the substitution therefor of the words "one shilling and sixpence."
