(Cap. 246)

THE SOCIAL GREETING TELEGRAM (PROHIBITION) ORDER, 1949

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by rule 1 AB of the Telegraph Rules, 1933 (as inserted therein by the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules 1943), I do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Greeting Telegrams (Prohibition) Order, 1949.

2. No person shall send any inland social greeting telegram between the 19th day of December, 1949, and the 3rd day of January, 1950.

3. In this Order "Social Greeting Telegram" means any telegram containing any greetings, congratulations, or good wishes.
