

## THE STAMP ISSUES (CANCELLATION) LAW, 1940

(Lew 28 of 1940) (Section 3(1))

A PROCLAMATION



HUGH FOOT,

By His Excellency Sir Hugh Mackintosh Foot, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies.

Whereas it is enacted by sub-section 1 of section 3 of The Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law, 1940, (Law 28 of 1940), that notwithstanding anything in any other Law contained the Governor at any time by Proclamation may declare that any issue of stamps shall cease to be valid and in such Proclamation may provide for the cancellation of such issue:

Now, therefore, I, Hugh Mackintosh Foot, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by sub-section 1 of section 3 of the said Law, do hereby proclaim and make known that from the date of the publication hereof in the Gazette all postage stamps issued by the Government of the Cayman Islands in celebration of the Coronation of Their Majesties King George the Sixth and Queen Elizabeth shall cease to be valid and the issue of all such stamps shall be and is hereby cancelled.

Given under my hand and the Broad Seal of Jamaica at King's House this 10th day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, in the fifteenth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George VI.

(Law 25 of 1947)

THE PROVIDENT FUND (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1951

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Executive Council by section 33(1) of the Provident Fund Law, 1947, the following Order is hereby made:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Provident Fund (Amendment) Order, 1951.
- 2. The First Schedule to the Provident Fund Law, 1947, is hereby amended by the addition to Part 15 of the Schedule of the following offices, with effect from the 21st of November, 1947.
