### POSTAL NOTICE

The introduction of AIRMAIL RATES for Second Class Mail matter and Newspapers is announced with effect from 2nd March, 1951.

The attention of the public is particularly drawn to the postal articles which comprise second class mail, and can be properly prepaid at, these new rates.

They are -

- Christmas Cards (unsealed),
- Small packets, Commercial. Papers
- printed matter, samples of . merchandise.

Post cards are NOT included, and have to be prepaid at letter rate.

The containers should not be sealed, and should be made up in a manner which allows of easy inspection. The public are warned that articles prepaid and posted as second class airmail, if found to contain items which should not be so rated, will be forwarded by surface route.

All packets intended for inclusion in these despatches should be clearly marked 'AIRMAIL'.

The new rates to be prepaid on these articles are:—

Jamaica -- 2nd Class Air Mail Rates

On the second of March, second class air mail rates were introduced in Jamaica, to all overseas Colonies. Rates for the B.W.I. Islands - 3d. per half oz. England and the U.K. countries 9d. U.S.A. and Central and South America - 4d. Africa and the Pacific Area - 1/6d. per half oz. in all cases. Only printed matter, circulars, can be sent by second class air mail.
