A BILL

ENTITLED

A LAW to provide for a change of the title "The Crown Agents for the Colonies" to "The Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations".

ENACTED by the Governor of Jamaica with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives.

1-This Law may be cited as the Crown Agents (Change Short title of Title) Law, 1954, and shall be deemed to have come into and comoperation on the 1st day of April, 1954.

2-All references to the Crown Agents for the Colonies in Change of any law or regulation or in any instrument issued pursuant to a statutory power and in force or having effect in this Island on or after the 1st day of April, 1954, shall be construed as references to the Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations.

The stamps are printed on Crown Agents white water marked paper.

The stamps bear a profile portrait of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II facing left.

THE TELEGRAPH LAW

(Cap. 246)

THE SOCIAL GREETING TELEGRAM (PROHIBITION) ORDER, 1954

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by rule 1 AB of the Telegraph Rules, 1933, (as inserted therein by the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1943), I do hereby make the following order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Social Greeting Telegrams (Prohibition)

Order, 1954.

2. No person shall send any inland social greeting telegram between the 17th day of December, 1954, and the 5th day of January, 1955.

3. In this Order "Social Greeting Telegram" means any telegram containing

any greetings, congratulations, or good wishes.
