1 May 1955; Airmail Rates [Gleaner 30 April, 1955].

POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT AIR MAIL RATES

It is hereby notified for general information that changes will be made in certain air-mail rates with effect from 1st May, 1955.-
Briefly, the changes are as follows:—

- a) Africa, Asia, the Far East, the Pacific and Australasia: present rate of 3/3 per ½ oz, will be reduced to 3/- per ½ oz.
Air letters for the above areas remain unchanged at 9d.
- b) All North and South American Countries:
Air letters will be accepted at 6d.
The ordinary air-mail rate remains unchanged.

Leaflets containing the detailed rates applicable may be obtained from the General Post Office, Kingston, and from all Post Offices.

The public are asked to note that correspondence posted prior to the 1st of May, 1955, will not be eligible for transmission at the new rates.

- The stamps are printed by the recess process on Crown Agents' watermarked paper. They are two-coloured with black vignettes.
23. "Man-o'-War at Port Royal" after a coloured lithograph of a painting by J. B. Kidd, with a green border.
 24. "Old Montego Bay" after a coloured lithograph of a painting by J. B. Kidd entitled "Montego Bay from Upton Hill" with a blue border.
 25. "Old Kingston" after a lithograph of a daguerreotype by Adolphe Duperly entitled "A view of King Street" having a claret border.
 26. "Abolition of Slavery 1838" after a coloured lithograph of the Proclamation Day in King's Square, Spanish Town, with a red border.

The stamps will be released to the public at all Post Offices and Postal Agencies in Jamaica on the 10th May, 1955, and will remain on sale for six months or until stocks are exhausted whichever first shall happen.

In accordance with the advice of the Council, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Post Office Law, Chapter 301, approved the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1955, which were made by the Acting Postmaster General on the 13th of October, 1955. Submission No. 1115/MCW-98 refers.

These Regulations increase the selling price of an International Reply Coupon from 8d. to 9d.
