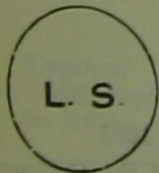
THE STAMP ISSUES (CANCELLATION) LAW

Chapter 367

(Sec. 3(1))

A PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HUGH MACKINTOSH FOOT,
Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished
Order of Saint Michael and Saint George,
Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian
Order, Officer of the Most Excellent Order
of the British Empire, Captain-General and
Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of
Jamaica and its Dependencies.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection 1 of section 3 of the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law, Chapter 367 that notwithstanding anything in any other Law contained

the Governor at any time by Proclamation may declare that any issue of stamps shall cease to be valid and in such Proclamation may provide for the cancellation of such issue:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, HUGH MACKINTOSH FOOT, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by subsection 1 of section 3 of the said Law, do hereby PROCLAIM AND MAKE KNOWN that as from the date on which this Proclamation shall come into force as hereinafter provided:—

- (a) all postage stamps of this Island issued in commemoration of the Silver Wedding Anniversary of Their Majesties King George VI and Queen Elizabeth, the denominations whereof are 1½d. and £1,
- (b) all postage stamps of this Island issued in celebration of the Universal Postal Union's 75th Anniversary the denominations whereof are 1½d., 2d., 3d. and 6d.,
- (c) the postage stamp of this Island issued during the reign of His Majesty King George VI the denomination whereof is 3d. and the colour green shall cease to be valid and the issue of all such stamps shall be and is hereby cancelled.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of April, 1956.

Given under my hand and the Broad Seal of Jamaica at King's House this 20th day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, in the fourth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

<p>Post card air rates reduced</p> <p>EFFECTIVE FROM next week Friday, June 1, air mail rates for post cards will be reduced by as much as 50 per cent in some cases.</p> <p>Most countries have had a special air rate for post cards, but Jamaica has all along charged the same postage for cards as for half-ounce letters.</p> <p>Air mail rates for postage are fixed by consideration of conveyance charges, based on the weight of the mail and distance to be flown, plus surface postal rates. Some examples of the saving to be derived as from June 1 in post cards sent by air-mail as against letters are as follows:</p> <p>Cayman Islands: ½ oz. letter 2½d; post card 2½d. BWIA generally: ½ oz. letter 6d; post card 4d. Bermuda, Cuba, Dominican Republic, North and South America: ½ oz. letter 8d; post card 5d. Europe: ½ oz. letter 1/6; post card 9d. Incidentally, Cayman island postage rates have always been 2½d at the present air mail letter rates to Canada and the U.S.A., Central and South America, are 8d per half oz.

Readers will appreciate the fact that from Jamaica to Alaska is 5,000 odd miles. On the other hand BOAC lifts all the mail from Jamaica to U.K. and the average distance is 4,200 to 5,000 miles, but certainly at a much higher rate per kilo, is being paid to this Company than to the American companies. Although similar mileage in distance is being flown. The air mail rates from Jamaica to England, the Azores, throughout Europe, Gibraltar, Ireland is 1/6d per half oz. It is interesting to see that the air mail rates from England to Jamaica is only 1/3d per half oz., which clearly indicates a difference in charges in letters going and letters coming to this Island.
