THE POST OFFICE (RATES OF POSTAGE) (AMENDMENT) (No. 1) ORDER, 1957

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by subsection 2 of section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Order made on the 30th day of November, 1957, by the Postmaster General under the said subsection 2 of section 7 of the Post Office Law is hereby approved:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage) (Amendment) (No. 1) Order, 1957, and shall be read and construed as one with the Order made by the Postmaster General under the Post Office Law, 1941, and published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement of the 28th day of May, 1942, at pages 245 to 255 inclusive (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) and all amendments thereto.
 - 2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1958.
- 3. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the following entry under the heading "(XII) Overseas Parcel Rates": —

- 6d. The 6d is printed in Red.
- 5d. The 5d is printed in Blue.
- 2d. The 2d is printed in Green.

The stamps will be released to the public at all Post Offices, Postal Agencies, and through Stamp Vendors in Jamaica on the 22nd day of April, 1958, and will remain on sale for one year or until stocks are exhausted whichever first shall happen.

The equivalent values of the current 6d, 5d and 2d stamps. will be withdrawn from sale at the close of business on the 21st day of April, 1958.

A PROCLAMATION



K. W. BLACKBURNE, Governor

By His Excellency Sir Kenneth William Blackburne, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies.

Whereas it is enacted by subsection (1) of section 3 of the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law that notwithstanding anything in any other Law contained the Governor at any time by Proclamation may declare that any issue of stamps shall

cease to be valid and in such Proclamation may provide for the cancellation of such issue:

Now, Therefore, I, Kenneth William Blackburne, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over the Island of Jamaica and its Dependencies, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection (1) of section 3 of the said Law do hereby proclaim and make known that as from the date on which this Proclamation shall come into force as hereinafter provided:—

- (a) the postage stamp of this Island issued during the reign of His Majesty King George VI, the denomination whereof is 11d. and the colour chocolate;
- (b) the postage stamp of this Island issued during the reign of His Majesty King George VI, the denomination whereof is 2d. and the colour grey and green;
- (c) the postage stamp of this Island issued during the reign of His Majesty King George VI, the denomination whereof is 9d. and the colour lake, shall cease to be valid and the issue of all such stamps shall be and is hereby cancelled.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the 1st day of September, 1963.

Given under my hand and the Broad Seal of Jamaica at King's House this 21st day of October in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight in the Seventh Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
