THE POST OFFICE LAW
(Cap. 301)

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) REGULATIONS, 1959

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by subsection (1) of section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Regulations made on the 18th day of May, 1959, by the Postmaster General under section (1) of section 7 of the said Law are hereby approved:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1959, and shall be read and construed as one with the Post Office Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto.
2. Regulation 111 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects:—
 - (a) by deleting from paragraph (1) thereof the words "at the price of eleven pence" and substituting therefor the words "and at such other Post Offices as the Postmaster General may consider convenient for the purpose at a price fixed from time to time in accordance with regulations agreed upon by the International Postal Union";
 - (b) by deleting from paragraph (2) thereof the words "Money Order" and "postage stamps of the value of three pence" and substituting therefor the words "Post" and "a postage stamp or stamps representing the postage payable on an unregistered single rate letter to a country not within the Commonwealth", respectively.

3. Regulation 112 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects:—

- (a) by deleting paragraph (1) and substituting therefor the following:
“ (1) Commonwealth Reply Coupons valid within the Commonwealth only shall be sold at the General Post Office, Kingston, and at such other Post Offices and at such prices as the Postmaster General may think fit.”;
- (b) by deleting from paragraph (2) thereof the words “Money Order” and “stamps of the value of two pence” and substituting therefor the words “Post” and “a postage stamp or stamps representing the postage prepayable on an unregistered single rate letter to a country within the Commonwealth”, respectively.

4. Regulation 113 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the word “Imperial” and substituting therefor the word “Commonwealth”.
