HIS EXCELLENCY the Governor directs the publication of the following Bill which it is proposed to introduce at the present session of the Legislature entitled "A Law to to Amend the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law", together with a Memorandum of Objects and Reasons for the Bill.

A BILL

ENTITLED

A LAW to Amend the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law.

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Representatives of Jamaica, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1—(1) This Law may be cited as the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) (Amendment) Law, 1961, and shall be read and construed as one with the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law (hereinafter referred to as the principal Law) and all amendments thereto, and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Governor by Proclamation.

Short title, construction, commencement and application.
Cap. 367.

(2) Subject to the provisions of section 56 of the Cayman Islands (Constitution) Order in Council, 1959, and of section 56 of the Turks and Caicos Islands (Constitution)

Order in Council, 1959, this Law shall apply to the Cayman Islands and the Turks and Caicos Islands.

Repeal of section 5 of principal Law. 2—Section 5 of the principal Law is hereby repealed.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to remove the application of the Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Law to the Turks and Caicos Islands and to the Cayman Islands in order to facilitate the introduction of appropriate Stamp Issues (Cancellation) Bills into the Legislatures of the Turks and Caicos Islands and of the Cayman Islands.
