THE POST OFFICE LAW

(Cap. 301)

THE POST OFFICE (RATES OF POSTAGE) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Order is hereby made with the approval of the Minister—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage) (Amendment) Order, 1963, and shall be read and construed as one with the Order made by the Postmaster General under the Post Office Law and published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement of the 28th day of May, 1942, at pages 245 to 255 inclusive (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) and all amendments thereto.
 - 2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1963.

3. The Schedules to the principal Order are hereby amended in the following respects—

(a) by the deletion from the column headed "Postcards—Single—Reply Paid" of the words "One Penny" and "Two Pence" and the substitution therefor of the words "One Penny Half-Penny" and "Three Pence" respectively;

(b) by the deletion from the column headed "Local Newspaper per copy" of the words "Half-Penny" and the substitution therefor of the words "One Penny";

- (c) by the deletion from the column headed "Letters for the first two ounces" of the words "Twopence and for every additional two ounces or fractional part thereof one penny" and the substitution therefor of the words "Three-pence and for every additional two ounces or fractional part thereof one penny half-penny";
- (d) by the deletion from the column headed "Printed and Commercial papers" of the words "Not exceeding two ounces, one penny, and half-penny for each additional two ounces or fractional part thereof" and the substitution therefor of the words "Not exceeding two ounces, one penny half-penny, and one penny for each additional ounces or fractional part thereof";
- (e) by revoking the column headed "Parcel Post Parcels for the first pound" and the words, "Fourpence and for every additional pound or fractional part thereof threepence" appearing thereunder and the substitution therefor of the following—

"Parcel Post parcels for each pound or each fractional part of a pound

in weight"

"Fourpence";

- (f) by the deletion from the column headed "Registration Fee" of the figures "4d." and "5d." and the words "one penny" and the substitution therefor of the figures and words "6d.", "9d." and "two pence" respectively;
- (g) by the deletion of the words "Fourpence" appearing under the heading "Overseas" and opposite the figures and words "(VII) Registration Fee" and the substitution therefor of the words "sixpence";
- (h) by the deletion of all the words appearing under the column headed "Sample Articles" and the substitution therefor of the following— "Not exceeding four ounces, penny halfpenny. Exceeding four ounces but not exceeding six ounces, two pence halfpenny. Exceeding six ounces but not exceeding eight ounces, three pence halfpenny"; and
- (i) by the deletion from under the heading "Schedule of Air Mail Rates" of the figure "8d." appearing under the sub-heading "Letters—Rate per ½ oz" and opposite the words "Canada" and the "U.S.A." and the substitution therefor of the figure "1/-" in each case.

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Regulations are hereby made with the approval of the Minister—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) Regulations, 1963, and shall be read and construed as one with the Post Office Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1963.
- 2. Regulation 35 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor—

"35. No inland parcel shall be forwarded or delivered by post if it exceeds twenty pounds in weight, or if it exceeds three feet six inches in length, or six feet in length, breadth and depth combined."

- 3. Regulation 101 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by the deletion from paragraph (b) of the words "twelve shillings" and the substitution therefor of the words "two pounds";
 - (b) by the deletion from paragraph (f) of the words "twelve shillings" and the substitution therefor of the words "two pounds".
- 4. Paragraph (2) of regulation 110 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "one guinea" and the substitution therefor of the words "two pounds".

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) REGULATIONS, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Regulations are hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1963, and shall be read and construed as one with the Post Office Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1963.
- 2. Regulation 74 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by deleting from paragraph (1) thereof the word "fourpence" and substituting therefor the word "sixpence";
 - (b) by deleting from paragraph (3) thereof the words "fivepence" and "one penny" and substituting therefor the words "ninepence" and "twopence" respectively.
- 3. Regulation 75 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the word "fourpence" and substituting therefor the word "sixpence".

4. Paragraph (a) of Regulation 77 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the words "eight pence" and substituting therefor the words "one shilling".

This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1963, and shall be read and construed as one with the Order made by the Post Office Law, 1941, and published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement of the 28th day of May, 1942, at pages 245 to 255 inclusive (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) and all amendments thereto.
 - 2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1963.
- 3. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of "Section (XII) Overseas Parcel Rates" inserted therein by the Post Office (Rates of Postage) (Amendment) Order, 1951, and the substitution therefor of the following:—

THE TELEGRAPH LAW

(Cap. 377)

THE TELEGRAPH (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Telegraph Law, the following Rules are hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1963, and shall be read and construed as one with the Telegraph Rules, 1933 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) and all amendments thereto.

(2) These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1963.

2. In rule 1 of the principal Rules-

(a) in paragraph (1) the words "one shilling and sixpence" and the words "one penny" are revoked and the words "two shillings" and "twopence" are substituted therefor respectively.

(b) in paragraph (2) the words "two shillings and threepence" in each place where those words occur and the words "one penny" are revoked and the words "two shillings and ninepence" in each such place and the words "twopence" are substituted therefor respectively.

3. In rule 28 of the principal Rules the figures "2/3d.", "1/7d." and "8d." are revoked and the figures "3/2d.", "2/2d." and "1/-" are substituted therefor respectively.

THE POST OFFICE LAW

(Cap. 301)

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) (No. 3) REGULATIONS, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Regulations are hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1963, and shall be read and construed as one with the Post Office Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1963.

2. Regulation 55 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects—

(a) by the deletion from sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of the word "threepence" wherever that word appears and the substitution therefor of the word "sixpence";

- (b) by the deletion from sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of the word "threepence" and the substitution therefor of the word "sixpence".
- 3. Regulation 71 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the word "sixpence" and the substitution therefor of the words "one shilling".
