AN ACT to Amend the Telegraph Law.

[ 21st March, 1968 ]

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Jamaica, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1—This Act may be cited as the Telegraph (Amendment) Act, 1968, and shall be read and construed as one with the Telegraph Law (hereinafter referred to as the principal Law) and all amendments thereto.

Short title and construction. Cap. 377.

2—Section 3 of the principal Law is hereby amended in the following respects—

Amendment of section 3 of principal Law.

- (a) by inserting in the definition of "telegraphs", next after the words "electric telegraphs", a comma and the words "including post office telephone lines or works,";

(b) by adding after the definition of "telegraphs" the following definitions—

"post office telephone line or work" means a wire or wires, conductor or other means, together with the poles or other supports therefor, used exclusively for the purpose of connecting a telephone in a post office with a telephone—

(a) in any other post office; or

(b) in any place declared under section 3A of this Law to be a specified place for the purposes of this Law;

"telephone" has the same meaning as in the Telephone Law."

Insertion of new section 3A in principal Law.

3—The principal Law is hereby amended by inserting therein, next after section 3 and above the heading "Telegraphs—General Management", the following section as section 3A—

"Declaration of specified places.

3A—The Minister may from time to time by order declare any place specified in the order to be a specified place for the purposes of this Law."

(Cap. 377)**THE TELEGRAPHS (SPECIFIED PLACES) ORDER, 1968**

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by section 3A of the Telegraph Law, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Telegraphs (Specified Places) Order, 1968.
2. The places specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be specified places for the purposes of the Law.

**THE TELEGRAPH LAW**  
(Cap. 377)

**THE TELEGRAPH (AMENDMENT) [(No. 2)] RULES, 1968**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by Section 7 of the Telegraph Law, the following Rules are hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Telegraph (Amendment) [(No. 2)] Rules, 1968, and shall be read and construed as one with the Telegraph Rules, 1933 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) and all amendments thereto.

(2) These Rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of December, 1968.

2. Rule 45 of the principal Rules is hereby amended by deleting from paragraph (d) thereof the words “which remain subject to instructions contained on page 25 and following pages” appearing at the end of the paragraph.
