## REVISION OF POSTAL RATES

Owing to the increasing deficit on the operations of the Post and Telegraph Department, it has been decided to increase certain postal rates in order to provide additional annual revenue of approximately $£ 160,000$, and so partially offset the deficit. The increases are shown in an appendix. The necessary amending Orders and/or Regulations under the Post Office Law, Cap. 301, and the Telegraph Law. Cap. 377 will be made and gazetted.
2. The deficits/operations (excluding Capital Expenditure and maintenance of buildings) over the four-year period from $1964 / 65$ to $1967 / 68$ are as follows:-


It will be seen that whilst expenditure has increased by approximately $19 \%$, revenue had risen by only $8 \%$. As a result the deficit has increased by nearly $45 \%$ over the period.
3. The Post and Telegraph Department is now examining the costs of the various services it provides to determine where a deficit is being incurred with a view to reducing or eliminating such deficit by revision of rates and/or by increased efficiency and productivity. The Telegraph Service has already been examined and similar action will be taken in respect of the following:-

4. Tolegraph Service

In $1966 / 67$ cost of the operations of this Service was $£ 373,862$ and with a revenue of only $£ 168,386$, it sustained a loss of $\mathrm{C} 205,476$. The rates were increased in 1963 from $1 / 6$ to $2 /-$ for a minimum of 12 words and from $1 / 2 d$ to $2 d$ for each additional word, and a further upward revision is therefore necessary. It is to be noted that the demand for the service has risen from 932,000 telegrams in 1964 to $1,063,000$ telegrams in 1967. This Service has been under constant review to improve its efficiency and reliability and to expand its facilities. In order to expedite the handling of telegrams, an automatic Tape relay system is now being installed at a total cost of about $£ 62,00 \mathrm{~J}$ and other improvements eg. installation of additional teleprinter machines, are also being undertaken.

It has therefore been decided to increase the basic rate for telegrams from $2 /-$ to $2 / 6$ for a minimum of 12 words. This is expected to realise an additional sum which will reduce the loss on the service to about \&150,000. The cost of operating the service will be re-examined further.

## 5. Overseas Parcel Rates - Bahamas

In view of the fact that the Bahamian Postal
Administration is now charging for handling parcels
destined for their Administration, it is necessary for the

Jamaican Postal Administration to recover full costs. This explains the sharp increase in these rates.

## 0. Mail Rates for Armed Forces

These rates are paid by Her Majesty's Forees serving overseas. These represent an upward adjustment to fall in line with the increases in concessionary rates charged by the United Kingdom Postal Authorities.

## 7. Effective Dates

It will be observed from the Appendix that most of the rates will become effective on lst July, 1968 . The reason is that Jamaica, as a member of the Universal Postal Union is required to give adequate notice to other members before changes in the international rates become effective. In cases where this is not applicable, the effective date is lst June 1968.
