**THE TELEGRAPH LAW**  
(Cap. 377)**THE TELEGRAPH (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1968**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Telegraph Law, the following Rules are hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 1968, and shall be read and construed as one with the Telegraph Rules, 1933 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules) and all amendments thereto.  
(2) These Rules shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1968.
2. Rule 1 of the principal Rules is hereby amended in the following respects—
  - (a) by inserting in paragraph (1) immediately after the words “two shillings” the words “and sixpence”;
  - (b) by deleting from paragraph (2) the words “two shillings and ninepence” wherever those words occur and substituting therefor the words “three shillings and threepence” in each case.

**THE POST OFFICE LAW**  
(Cap. 301)**THE POST OFFICE (RATES OF POSTAGE) (AMENDMENT) ORDER, 1968**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by subsection (2) of section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Order is hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage) (Amendment) Order, 1968, and shall be read and construed as one with the Order made under the Post Office Law, 1941 and published in the Jamaica Gazette Supplement of the 28th May, 1942 at pages 245 to 255 inclusive (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) and all amendments thereto.
2. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1968.
3. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended in the following respects—
  - (a) by deleting from under the heading “(XII) Overseas Parcel Rates” the rates relating to Bahamas and substituting therefor the rates specified in the First Schedule to this Order; and

- (b) by deleting therefrom the words specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order and substituting therefor in their respective order the words specified in the second column of the said Schedule.

**THE POST OFFICE LAW**  
(Cap. 301)

**THE POST OFFICE (RATES OF POSTAGE) (HER MAJESTY'S FORCES) ORDER, 1968**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Order is hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Post Office (Rates of Postage) (Her Majesty's Forces) Order, 1968, and shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1968.
2. In this Order—  
 "authorized officer" means any person authorized by the Chief of Staff of the Jamaica Defence Force to collect mails addressed to members of British Forces Overseas and thereafter deliver such mails to the Postmaster General;  
 "British Forces Overseas" means any naval, military or air forces raised in any territory within the Commonwealth by Her Majesty or the government of such territory and such forces are serving in a country other than Jamaica;  
 "Her Majesty's Forces" means any of the naval, military or air forces raised in the United Kingdom by Her Majesty.
3. The rates of postage to be paid by members of Her Majesty's Forces serving in Jamaica in respect of mails addressed to members of British Forces Overseas, shall be as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
4. The provisions of paragraph 3 of this Order shall apply only if the mails are delivered to the Postmaster General by an authorized officer of the Jamaica Defence Force.
