THE POST OFFICE LAW
(Cap. 301)

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) (No. 3) REGULATIONS, 1969

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Postmaster General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, the following Regulations are hereby made with the approval of the Minister:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1969, and shall be read and construed as one with the Post Office Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto.

2. Regulation 35 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor—

“Limits of
weight and
size for
inland
parcels.

35. (1) No inland parcel shall be forwarded or delivered by post if it exceeds twenty pounds in weight, or if it exceeds three feet six inches in length, or six feet in length, breadth and depth combined, or if it is less than four inches in length or two and three-quarters inches in breadth.

(2) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (3) of this regulation no inland parcel made up in the form of a roll shall be forwarded or delivered by post if the length and the

greatest circumference measured in a direction other than the length exceed six feet or are less than six and three-quarters inches, or if the greatest dimension exceeds three feet six inches or is less than four inches.

(3) Where the dimensions of an inland parcel, whether made up in the form of a roll or of a packet, are less than the minimum dimensions prescribed aforesaid respectively, such parcel may be forwarded or delivered by post if it bears a rectangular address label made of cardboard or strong paper of which the dimensions are not less than the minimum dimensions prescribed in respect of such parcel.”.

3. Regulation 111 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the word “International” wherever it appears and substituting therefor the word “Universal”.

4. Regulation 164 of the principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor—

164. For the transaction of the classes of public business specified in the second column of the Tenth Schedule, Post Offices and postal agencies described in the first column of the said Schedule shall be opened between the hours and on the days (not being a Sunday or a public general holiday) specified in relation thereto in the third column of the said Schedule.”.

5. Regulations 165 and 166 of the principal Regulations are hereby revoked.

6. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting therefrom the Fifth and Sixth Schedules and substituting therefor, respectively, the following—

THE POST OFFICE LAW
(Cap. 301)

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) (NO. 4) REGULATIONS, 1969

In exercise of the power conferred upon the Postmaster-General by section 7 of the Post Office Law, and with the approval of the Minister, the following Regulations are hereby made:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Amendment) (No. 4) Regulations, 1969, and shall be read and construed as one with the Post Office Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations) and all amendments thereto.

2. Regulation 117 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (1) and substituting therefor the following as paragraph (1)—

“(1) The maximum amount for which a single money order may be drawn on—

- (a) Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and on any country sent through the intermediary of the United Kingdom, Eire, Antigua, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, British Honduras, Cayman Islands, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Montserrat, Nevis, St. Kitts, St. Lucia, Tortola, Trinidad and Tobago and Turks Islands shall be eighty Jamaican dollars;
- (b) Canada, the United States of America and Canal Zone, shall be one hundred Canadian or United States of America dollars, as the case may be.”.

3. Regulation 118 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects—

- (a) by deleting paragraph (1) and substituting therefor the following as paragraph (1)—

“(1) All money orders shall be expressed in Jamaican dollars except those drawn upon Canada, the United States of America and Canal Zone, which shall be expressed in Canadian or United States of America dollars and cents as the case, may be.”.

- (b) by deleting from paragraph (2) the word “penny” and substituting therefor the word “cent”.

4. Regulation 156 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting paragraph (1) and substituting therefor the following as paragraph (1)—

“(1) The sender of a Jamaican or a British postal order may increase its value by not more than nine cents by affixing Jamaican postage stamps not exceeding two in number to the face of the order in the places provided.”.

5. The principal Regulations are hereby amended by deleting the Seventh Schedule and substituting therefor the following as the Seventh Schedule—

THE CONSTABULARY FORCE LAW
(Cap. 72)

THE JAMAICA CONSTABULARY FORCE BAND (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1969

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Commissioner of Police by section 95 of the Jamaica Constabulary Force Law, the following Rules are hereby made:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Jamaica Constabulary Force Band (Amendment) Rules, 1969, and shall be read and construed as one with the Jamaica Constabulary Force Band Rules, 1963, hereinafter referred to as the principal Rules.

2. The principal Rules are hereby amended by deleting therefrom the Schedule and substituting therefor the following Schedule—

SCHEDULE

Scale of Fees

A. Concerts and stage shows organised for profit—

(a) in Kingston	\$60.00
(b) elsewhere in Jamaica	\$60.00
(c) cocktail parties held in Kingston for the benefit of guests only, during a period not exceeding one and one-half hours	\$40.00
(d) each additional hour or part thereof	\$25.00

- B. Programmes at hotels—
 (a) for the benefit of guests only, during a period not exceeding one and one-half hours \$60.00
 (b) each additional hour or part thereof \$30.00
- C. Concerts held at churches—
 (a) in Kingston for profit \$50.00
 (b) elsewhere in Jamaica for profit \$50.00
 (c) in Kingston on a non-profit basis \$40.00
- D. Programmes sponsored by charitable organisations—
 The charges in respect of such performances shall be determined by the Commissioner of Police, and any charge so determined shall not be less than \$20.00
- E. Arrangements of music—
 special arrangements of music by the Director for an organisation other than the Jamaica Constabulary Force Band \$15.00
 per score
- F. Other Charges—
 (a) charges in respect of all other engagements shall be determined by the Commissioner of Police after consultation with the Band President;
 (b) charges in respect of transportation shall be payable in accordance with the actual reasonable expenditure incurred for that purpose, and shall be made in respect of items A to D, except where the venue is in Kingston;
 (c) charges for subsistence in respect of items A to D shall be computed in accordance with the rates payable by the Government of Jamaica to the members of the Band."
