THE DECIMAL CURRENCY ACT, 1969

(Act 7 of 1969)

THE DECIMAL CURRENCY (SPECIFIED INSTRUMENTS) (MODIFICATION) ORDER, 1970

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Minister by subsection (3) of section 5 of the Decimal Currency Act, 1969, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Decimal Currency (Specified Instruments) (Modification) Order, 1970.

2. In this Order "specified instruments" means the several instruments specified in the First Schedule hereto.

3. Any references to pence in the amounts prescribed by the specified instruments shall be read and construed as references to a corresponding amount of money in the decimal currency of the Island calculated on the basis of the equivalents specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

THE DECIMAL CURRENCY ACT, 1969

(Act 7 of 1969)

**THE DECIMAL CURRENCY (MISCELLANEOUS LAWS AND ACTS) (MODIFICATION)
ORDER, 1970**

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Minister by section 5 of the Decimal Currency Act, 1969, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Decimal Currency (Miscellaneous Laws and Acts) (Modification) Order, 1970.

2. From and after the coming into operation of this Order, the several references to amounts of money in the former currency of the Island in such provisions of such Laws and Acts as are mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be read and construed as reference to the amounts of money in the decimal currency of the Island specified respectively in relation thereto in the corresponding provisions set out in the second column of the Schedule; and, accordingly, the provisions mentioned in the first column aforesaid shall be adapted and modified in the manner specified in relation to them respectively in the second column aforesaid.

The Post Office Law, (Cap. 301) section 10	In lieu of the words "One penny" substitute the words "One cent"
The Stamp Duty Law (Cap. 366) subsections (1) and (2) of section 23, section 52, and the Schedule	In lieu of the word "twopence" at subsections (1) and (2) of section 23, substitute the words "two cents". In lieu of the word "threepence" at section 52 substitute the words "three cents". Any reference in the Schedule to the amounts 1d, 2d, 3d, and 9d shall be read and construed as reference to 1c, 2c, 2c, and 8c respectively.
The Tax Collection Law (Cap. 375) Schedule	Any reference to the amounts 3d and 1d shall be read and construed as reference to 2c and 1c respectively.
