Articles regarding New postal rates effective 1 Oct 1972

SOME NEW POSTAL RATES EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1

Increases in some postal rates will go into effect on Sunday. Proposals for the increases were announced by Government during the last Budget: debate a JIS release said yesterday.

Rates for Inland letters will be increased from 3c to 5c but there will be no increases in the charges of airmail letters and parcels .except in the case of Commonwealth Caribbean countries, where the rates will be increased from 8c to 10c thus bringing these countries in line with the charges for North, Central and South America and the rest of the Caribbean.

To go with the increase in inland rates, the authorities will increase the weight limit from two to four ounces.

Charges for Inland parcels will be increased also; the new rates being 6c per pound. To ensure promptness in the collection of Parcels by the public a new storage fee for parcels will be enforced. Parcels not collected within one month after the registration of the parcel notice, will be subjected to a charge of 50c and an additional 10c per day after the first month. Postage rates for post cards, newspapers and other printed matter will be doubled, but at the same time the weight limit will be simultaneously increased.

Increases

There will be increases in the area of Post Office service charges — for example there will be increases in rates for post boxes, registration fees and express delivery charges.

The air parcel-post rates to all countries to which the service extends will be amended. In, some instances the rates will be lowered, for example in the cases of Australia and Hong Kong. Two countries have been added to the service — Netherlands Antilles (including Surinam and Venezuela).

There will no longer be the special Commonwealth surface letter rate. Surface letters for all destinations outside of Jamaica will have to be pre-paid at the foreign-letter rate. Surface parcel-post charges to all countries will be increased

Turning to more mundane matters, certain postal increases were introduced with effect from October 1st. After being for long one of the cheapest places from which to despatch mails, Jamaica is now falling into line with other countries! The inland letter rate is increased to 5c and the airmail rate to Commonwealth Caribbean countries has risen to 10c., thus becoming the same as that for the rest of the American continent. Inland and airmail parcel rates are both amended, whilst postcard, newspaper and printed matter rates are all doubled with an increase in the weight limit allowed. Inland postcards will now cost 2c and a special rate of 4c has been introduced for Christmas cards. Could not a similar idea be operated in this country?

All overseas seammil will now be sent at the foreign letter rate, the former Commonwealth preference having been abolished. Registration envelopes will cost 1c extra in addition to the postage and registration fee, which itself has been raised to 20c, with increases also in charges for Express Letters and special services. It will be interesting to see what effect this increase has on the new registered envelopes, ordered at the old rates and now being printed.

New postal Rates today

New postal rates come into effect today. Explanation of the major changes in charges for local and foreign letters and parcels has been circulated to post offices and postal agencies by the Post Master General. A JIS release stated.

The new rates have been circulated to the post offices and Postal agencies since mid-September in order that personnel could familiarize themselves with the new rates.

The new rate for Inland letters la now increased front 3 cent to 5 cents, but there is no Increase in the charges for airmail letters and parcels, except to the case of Commonwealth Caribbean countries where the rates have been increased from 8 to 10 cents The weight limit for Inland letters have been increased from two to four ounces.

Rate increases are also going into effect with respect to inland parcels, post cards and printed matter. There are Increases in rates or postal service charges A new storage fee for parcels will be enforced.

There has been no change in the rate for letters by Surface. Mail EXCEPT that there will no longer be a preferential rate for Commonwealth countries. Surface letters to all overseas destinations will now be pre-paid at the regular Foreign letter Rate.

PARCEL STORAGE CHARGES -

To ensure prompt collection of parcels, a fee of 50c will be charged for parcels coming from abroad which have been left uncollected 1 month after the date of issue of the parcel notice - Each additional day - 10c e.g. Notice date-stamped 1st October, 1972. Fee of 50c due on 2nd November, 1972 and from 3rd November, 1972 10c per day until delivered.

1 Oct 1972; Postage Rate Increase [Foster Stamp-Collecting 14 Dec 1972]

Turning to more mundane matters, certain postal increases were introduced with effect from October 1st. After being for long one of the cheapest places from which to despatch mails, Jamaica is now falling into line with other countries! The inland letter rate is increased to 5c and the airmail rate to Commonwealth Caribbean countries has risen to 10c., thus becoming the same as that for the rest of the American continent. Inland and airmail parcel rates are both amended, whilst postcard, newspaper and printed matter rates are all doubled with an increase in the weight limit allowed. Inland postcards will now cost 2c and a special rate of 4c has been introduced for Christmas cards.

All overseas seamount will now be sent at the foreign letter rate, the former Commonwealth preference having been abolished. Registration envelopes will cost 1c extra in addition to the postage and registration fee, which itself has been raised to 20c, with increases also in charges for Express Letters and special services. It will be interesting to see what effect this increase has on the new registered envelopes, ordered at the old rates and now being printed.
