REVISION OF POSTAGE RATES -CHARGES 1979 A: R. L. DIBRARY

On the 1st May, 1975, inland postal and telegraph. charges were last increased as a result of the accumulating deficits in the operations of the Post and Telegraphs Department brought about by escalations in salaries, wages, rentals, and the cost of transporting mails, among other factors.

Increases in overseas mail charges became necessary on 1st January, 1976, as a result of the decisions of the 1974

Lausanne Postal Union Congress.

- 2. By international convention the costs of the conveyance and handling of mails between countries are calculated in terms of the United States dollar.
- 3. Since 1976, there have been further increases in costs arising from the devaluation of the Jamaican dollar, new wage agreements, mail transport, rentals and fuel.
- 4. New rates are proposed and in preparing these the opportunity has been taken to introduce certain changes.

 These are:

1) NEWSPAPERS SENT BY AIR MAIL

This category of post is to be removed as has been done by most postal administrations worldwide. News-papers will now be treated as "Second Class Matter."

B) AIRMAIL POSTCARD

The airmail postcard has been calculated at a dommon rate for all destinations instead of at a different rate for each of three regions.

c' AIR PARCEL POST

Air parcel post charges were formerly calculated on a single unit i.e., per half pound. Instead of a flat rate for each half-pound of weight, there is to be a charge for the first pound and a reduced charge for each additional pound.

- 5. The new rates which are to take effect from 1st
 July, 1979 reflect increases as follows:
 - On inland mails and services 50%
 - On international mails and services of the order of 75% - 100%.
- 6. It is estimated that an additional revenue intake of approximately \$2.5 million will accrue from the proposed increases for the financial year 1979/80.
- 7. The new schedules of rates are to be gazetted shortly. Excerpts from these schedules are attached for the information of the House.
